Your Webelos had the opportunity to earn the following Activity Badges, Pins, Belt Loops or Awards. If your Scout attended all five days and stayed for the Webelos Campout then his Pack can honor him with the following:

BB Gun Belt Loop
BB Gun Pin
Archery Belt Loop
Outdoor Activity Award
Naturalist Activity Badge
Outdoorsman Activity Badge
Craftsman (partial)

Please review the following breakdown of Activities by Day and by Award.

| Archery Belt Loop | Either day of scheduled Archery |

**Even though each boy was required to attend the Safety training on Monday, the Safety talk was given (abbreviated form) prior to each session Tuesday thru Friday.

Naturalist Activity Badge was earned if Scout attended Monday thru Friday

Naturalist Requirements: **Know, Commit and Practice** were discussed each day of camp. **All five of the requirements were done.**

Monday: Learn about the bird flyways closest to your home. Find out which birds use these flyways. **(6)**

Tuesday: Examples of a producer, and a decomposer in the food chain of an ecosystem. How have humans changed the balance of nature? How you can help protect the balance of nature. **(9)** (These were also covered briefly on Monday, Thursday and Friday)
In addition, the boys were able to watch for birds and identify the birds in the park for Five days **(5)**

Wednesday: Learn to identify poisonous plants and venomous reptiles found in your area. **(7)**

Thursday: Watch six wild animals (birds, snakes, spiders, turtles etc.) Describe their environment and what they do in their habitat. **(8)**

Friday: Identify a plant, bird, or wild animal that is found only in your area of the country. Tell why it survives only in your area. **(10)**

Outdoorsman Activity Badge was earned if Scout attended Monday thru Friday and participated in the Webelos Overnighter**

With your parent or guardian, take part in a Webelos den overnight campout or a family campout. Sleep in a tent that you have helped pitch

With your parent or guardian, camp overnight with a Boy Scout troop. Sleep in a tent you have helped pitch

Monday: What to Take on a Hike (part of Outdoorsman #9)
Camping gear what to bring. (packing for the overnighter)

Tuesday: Leave No Trace-Completed Outdoorsman #5
Requirement #1 of the Leave No Trace Awareness Award
Also covered: Spelunker's Code and Ten Essentials

Wednesday: Whipping and Fusing Rope-Outdoorsman #10
Square Knot, 2 Half Hitches and Taut line Hitch under Outdoorsman #11
Overhand knot, overhand bend (maybe a couple of rope tricks, too!)
*Note: On completion of requirements, "a scout learns, is tested, practices and then is recognized." We did the instructional part of #10 and #11

Thursday: More Whipping/Fusing Rope-follow up instruction on Outdoorsman requirement #10 (should demonstrate skill in Den or Pack) Fire and Fire Safety-completed instructional portion of Outdoorsman #7. Extra: Flint and Steel fire starting and Fireman Chit introduction-for when they get to be Boy Scouts.

Friday: Visit a nearby Boy Scout camp with your Webelos #12 (stay for the campout and participate in activities) Also, finished Map and Compass requirements #1 and #2 of the Cub Scout Academics belt loop for Map and Compass***completion #3 requires they draw a street map of their neighborhood.

Craftsman Activity Badge (partial completion)

Monday: Explain how to safely handle the tools used for this Activity Badge (#1)

Tuesday: Leather Stamping (one of the four useful items in #4)

Wednesday: Rain Gutter Regatta

Thursday: Wood Trivets (made with glue)

Friday: Duct Tape Wallets (**one** of the four useful items in **#4**)

Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award (earn Outdoorsman and 5 outdoor activities)

- 1) Participate in a nature hike in your local area. **(Wednesday in Naturalist)**
- 2) Participate in an outdoor activity such as a picnic or park fun day. **(All week)**
- 3) Explain the buddy system and tell what to do if lost. Explain the importance of cooperation. **(Monday in Outdoorsman)**
- 4) Attend a pack overnigher. Be responsible and prepared for this event. **(Webelos campout on Friday)**
- 5) Complete an outdoor service project in your community. **(Monday-Friday-we did some of this each day)**
- 6) Participate in a nature observation activity. Describe or illustrate your observations. **(Monday thru Friday)**
- 7) Participate in an outdoor campfire program. Perform in a skit, sing a song, or take part in a ceremony. **(Friday campout)**
- 8) Explore a local city park. Discuss how a good citizen obeys the park rules. **(Monday thru Friday)**
